



She holds a Bachelor's degree in Business Communication and is passionate about Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and Gender-Based Violence (GBV). Through her efforts, she has successfully mobilized approximately 500 women from the Western and Southern regions of Cameroon for training in entrepreneurship, leadership, and development. Ms. Nkaleu has also been instrumental in halting inhumane widowhood rites by influencing family heads. She is the founder of GIC de Transformations aux Profits des Femmes Rurales and a member of several women's association networks. She has participated in various training sessions and seminars on management and women's rights in Paris, Belgium, Switzerland, and London, and collaborates with organizations such as Widows for Peace and the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and the Family (MINPROFF) in Cameroon. She is also a recipient of the "Meilleure dans le programme de l'autonomisation des femmes rurales par la GREFC-Md Internationale" award.

Dr. Zoneziwoh Mbondgulo-Wondieh

Dr. Zoneziwoh Mbondgulo-Wondieh is an award-winning feminist humanitarian, storyteller, and researcher with over 15 years of experience in gender and digital activism, movement building, policy advocacy, and youth leadership. She is the Executive Director of Women for a Change (WFAC) in Cameroon, where she designs and leads programs advancing women and girls' sexual and reproductive health rights, leadership, and empowerment. Her work creates inclusive spaces for women and girls to engage with policymakers at the highest levels, including the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), while raising awareness of national and international women's rights protocols such as the Maputo Protocol and the Beijing Platform for Action.

Dr. Zoneziwoh's advocacy has transformed the lives of over a million girls and young women across the Central African subregion, expanding access for more than 100,000 to participate in critical national and international spaces where they can claim their rights and amplify their voices.

She currently serves as the Central Africa Subregional Coordinator for AfWID (the African Women's Development and Communication Network) and is a member of its steering committee. She regards AfWID25, the pan-African women's rights gathering marking the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration, as a pivotal opportunity to connect with Africa's greatest minds and accelerate progress toward gender equality on the continent.

Dr. Zoneziwoh holds a Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Sciences, an MSc in Sex and Gender, and a PhD in International Relations and Conflict Resolutions. Her extensive contributions have cemented her place as a leading voice in the fight for gender justice and women's rights across Africa.
